Notes:

The Speaker has certified that the Prisoners (Disclosure of Information About Victims) Bill relates exclusively to England and Wales on matters within devolved legislative competence, under Standing Order No. 83J. All Members of the House may speak, move motions or vote in the Committee of the whole House on this Bill (different provision is made for Bills relating only to England).

As the Bill will (presumably) be reported from the Committee of the whole House as amended, there could be a report (consideration) stage, but Mr Speaker is unlikely to select for report stage any New Clauses or Amendments which have been (or could have been) tabled for Committee of the whole House.

After the report stage (if any), the Legislative Grand Committee (England and Wales) will be asked to pass a consent motion for the Bill as a whole. The Speaker has provisionally certified under Standing Order No. 83L that, if the Bill is amended only by the Government Amendments, the Bill as amended will relate exclusively to England and Wales on matters within devolved legislative competence, under Standing Order No. 83J.

The consent motion may be debated in the Legislative Grand Committee (England and Wales) only if there is any time left before the end of 2 hours after commencement of proceedings on the Bill in Committee of the whole House. Any Member of the House may speak in the Legislative Grand Committee (England and Wales), if there is any time for debate. If there is no time left for debate, the motion will be decided in the Legislative Grand Committee (England and Wales) immediately, without debate.

Only Members for constituencies in England or Wales may move motions or vote in the Legislative Grand Committee (England and Wales).

Proceedings on Third Reading may continue up to no later than 3 hours after the commencement of proceedings on the Bill in Committee of the whole House. All Members of the House may speak (if there is time) and vote on Third Reading.
